FISH VETERINARY SERVICES



 the importance of storage re temperatures, and age of the chemicals to
 be used. ALWAYS check the expiry dates. Unfortunately for Ces he lost the
 majority of his Koi collection 1 week before the Show. It can happen to any
 of us experienced Koi keepers to the novice. Remember! ALWAYS CHECK
 DATES.

Rod Hansen presented the meeting with with a great quiz to challenge our knowledge on Koi as always it created great interest whilst at the same time it enhanced our knowledge even further. Thanks to Rod it was great fun and also it highlighted the amount of up to date information available coming from the Nigishrin Magazine from the Z.N.A. POND PROFILE

Owner: Shona Whaite, Forrestfield

Volume: 13,500 litres. Approx 4m x 3m x 1.5m deep at bottom drain

Construction: Pond liner (carpet layer underneath)

Filtration: Nexus 200, UV—these sat in a filter "pit" about 2 metres

away from pond so they were gravity fed from pond.

Design points: completely below ground, vertical walls, floor sloped to 1

bottom drain

Return: OASE 10,000LPH pump which went to bamboo water spout.

Things I like about the pond:

- Large enough volume for our small number of fish, they had room to move
- Had many of the essential koi pond design aspects: vertical walls, sloped floor, bottom drain
- The style matched our backyard (but in hindsight it wasn't worth it and functionality should've come before looks!)


If I could change anything...

- I would've listened to advice to make pond half above/half below ground, not all below ground! We had a lot of problems with leaves blowing in.

 Trying to clean filters which are sitting in a pit is also a pain!
- I would've contacted the Koi Society BEFORE designing our backyard. The spot we reserved for the pond was right under a deciduous tree so always had leaves falling into it
- I would've listened to advice to add a solids pre-filter in front of the Nexus—they work really well but don't handle big leaves or string algae very well—because of the pond's location we had both of these and had to remove them from the Nexus every couple of days.







This unusual pond in the USA is a converted swimming pool, with a floating island in the middle! To keep the island afloat, she has a bunch of bottles in nets underneath. Plus there are some posts so if one side gets overloaded, it won't tip over. Total volume is about 30,000 gallons (around 100,000 litres). No details are provided about what sort of filtration is attached to the pond, but some photos show an area off to the side which looks like it holds the filters.
