**Next month's meeting:** The next Northern Branch meeting will be on Tuesday 10 November 2009. We have a speaker from the TAFE fish breeding facility in Fremantle—see page 2 for details—this will be a very interesting talk so don't miss out!



#### Breeding

The breeding season is upon us, and there were plenty of questions about the topic. A few points that were discussed

- Check the minimum predicted temperature not just the maximum. Everyone has a different temperature they like to wait until before spawning—Allan's recommended temperature is around 20 degrees (day) and not dropping below about 10 at night.
- Anything can be used as spawning material—nets, mats, tree branches, grass runners tied together, rope, etc.
- When culling Showa babies, cull all white babies at about 3-5 days. Finish culling around one week old as the fragile gills/fins develop at about 10-21 days so handling during this time should not be done.

#### Upcoming topics

We had input from everyone at the meeting about what they would like some upcoming presentations to be about—breeding, blanket weed, food & homemade filters were just some of the suggestions, so we'll be looking at putting these together over the next few months.

#### Carp Pox

This was discussed briefly, and the main points were that it is a type of herpes virus, so is contagious at certain times (similar to human cold sores). As with many diseases, good water quality and low stress levels will help a koi fight it off. Carp pox is thought to be less common these days as husbandry & water quality improve.

#### Allan's UK trip

Allan showed some photos from his visit to the South East Koi Show in England. The show is fairly large with almost 400 fish being shown. There are also fish for sale with very big price tags! We'll share some of the photos in the next issue.

#### Water testing

Allan showed some photos of water test results from one of his grow-out ponds. The ammonia was very high at over 8ppm, and nitrite was 2-3ppm! He corrected this with several large water changes, reduced feeding and adding a plant filter. He stressed that everyone should regularly test water as fish can look & behave perfectly normal even when water quality is terrible. He was lucky to still have these babies alive as he happened to have a low pH at the time. WELCOME & NEWS

Another important message came from Richmond's assessment and that is for fish keepers to be more persistent with their water changes to reduce the Nitrates in the water. Remember the recommended 10% per week as printed in the Koi Bible.




#### RE: Koi with swollen coelomic cavity (abdomen).

#### History

Bilaterally symmetrical swelling of abdomen creating a pot-bellied appearance to the fish. Swelling became progressively larger over the last 2 months. No signs of protruding scales or eves. No prominence of vasculature. Fish tends to sit at the bottom. Fish fork length = 140mm.



Microscopic examination of gill biopsy and mucus scrape were negative for parasites.



Coelomic aspirate was either unrewarding or drew variable volumes of pale amber clear liquid.

\*It is suggested that the original pond water needs massive frequent partial water changes to reduce to <50 ppm.

#### Surgery

Surgery was conducted with the help of my colleague Aaron Raney.

• Pre-surgical medications administered include 5mg/kg enrofloxacin IM & 2mg/kg dexamethasone IM.

- Fish was anaesthetised using Aqui-S in water at 0.6ml/L.
- Induction started at 10:20am.

• When fish has lost its locomotor reflexes but still maintaining gill movement, it was placed onto the table and anaesthesia was maintained by alternating between the anaesthetic solution and freshwater. This was supplied to the fish's buccal cavity as a continuous flow using a small water pump and tubing.

- A left paramedian approach for exploratory laparotomy was chosen. Three rows of scales were removed running the length of the coelomic cavity.
- First incision made at 10:40am.

• Exploration revealed intact gastrointestinal tract and swim bladder. A large multinodular cystic soft tissue mass resembling an ovarian neoplasm was found predominantly on the right side of the coelomic cavity. The mass and fluid were removed.

• Fish was sutured (stitched up) using Maxon 4-0 (synthetic monofilament). Final stitch placed at 12:27pm.



• 8ml of air was aspirated from the coelomic cavity to achieve neutral buoyancy.

• Recovery induced with 0.4ml of 20mg/ml Doxapram and with small powerhead pump.

Vitamin C added to aerated recovery tank at 10mg/L.

Total surgery time = 1.5 hours
