General discussion:-


Again an excellent turn out at 26 people at the Meeting and good to see some well earned support for our Prezzi and Committee. Members keep up the good work

Large V's Small, it has been the matter of debate on a number of occasions between us koi hobbyists. At our level, I believe it is better to have as many members as possible showing, and if this means the smaller size classes are attracting larger entries at the Annual Show ... then great. On the other hand anyone who has bred koi appreciates it is much more difficult to get a good large fish > 65cms than a good small fish. I was reading a book recently and I came across this translated quote from a Japanese master breeder, maybe this explains it best.

"Size and body form are the two main criteria in Nishikigoi, and small faults with color, pattern and fins are of lesser importance. I regard the expression "absolute quality" as well suited for the enthusiast to apply; everyone likes an attractive and boldly patterned koi, but size and the associated impressive appearance are inseparatable from absolute quality! Thus by 'absolute quality' is meant primary the form and presence of a koi. An impressive large body is the basic canvas on which the pattern can manifest itself"

Don't agree then think about our current 3 years x Grand Champ! She has no hi pattern on 2/5ths or her body towards the tale. I have heard lots of people at auctions and when buying, make statements that a fish does not have hi towards the tail. I have said it myself. As a result the fish is dismissed. Phong's Grand Champ was also sold 3 times before she won Grand Champ! Could it be that the body and presence had not developed but when it did the lack of hi pattern toward the tail was not a pre requisite for absolute quality? Oh yes size matters, or does it ...something worth thinking about "JJ"

EUTHANASIA

Euthanising a fish is something we may all need to do one day, and having a bit of knowledge before that day comes can makes it a lot less stressful for you & the koi.

Before euthanasia is considered it is worth noting that there are circumstances where a fish may appear to be beyond help, but with a little perseverance may survive and go on to live many years. It is not unusual to hear members tell of fish that survived after jumping out of a pond for half an hour or more, and thanks to their dedicated owner holding them above well oxygenated water for several hours, they have made a full recovery.

Fish vet services are also available in Perth, so if you aren't sure what a particular problem is, or if it is treatable, give them a call.

If you are in the unfortunate position of needing to humanely euthanise a fish which is beyond help, here are some guidelines

One of the most effective ways to humanely kill a fish is to hit it very hard on the head, or cut it's head off. This will kill it instantly. The downside is that you need to be fairly experienced at this and make sure you have the strength and accuracy to kill them on the first hit.

Understandably, some koi keepers aren't comfortable with this method, but we have included it just to let everyone know that if done properly, it is a humane way to go.

Oil of Cloves is an effective anesthetic which can be used for euthanasia. Remove the fish from the pond and place in a container (make it small so you don't need to use lots of oil, but large enough for the

koi to move comfortably.

Add a few drops at a time and gently stir. The fish will slowly go to sleep. Keep adding drops & gently stirring until there is no gill movement or reflex when touched. At this point it is sometimes difficult to judge whether the fish is unconscious or dead, so after this, bag the fish in water and place it in your freezer.

Oil of Cloves can be bought from most chemists.
