Koi in art-does direction mean anything?

It is widely believed by the Japanese personalities that a Koi fish that swims down symbolizes the act of overcoming the hardships that come along the way. Meanwhile, if the Koi fish swims up, it means that the obstacles have already been overcome.

In some other beliefs, the Koi fish that is directed downwards while surrounded by the maple leaves emphasizes the fall season whereas the upward direction of the Koi fish with cherry blossoms all around indicates the spring.

KSWA Northern Branch News

The Northern Branch meeting in March was very busy. A warm welcome to new members and visitors Mark, Clifford and Clayton. Allan then provided an update about outcomes from the recent committee meeting including discussing:

- the change in the use of central blue bins at the show (they won't be used any more);

- a clarification about table show entrant rules: fish have to be no older than from the prior year's spawning season ie assuming a Sept to March breeding season then they would be 14 to 20 months old at show time in May.
- a reminder about the 2009 show date being 24 May.

I heard someone ask why are all the tubs blue? Good question!

The simple answer is that blue reproduces a light that is most closely related to daylight. It is also the color that least affects the colors on the koi of red and white. So if you want your koi to look their best put them in a blue bin, it is the best choice!

At our next meeting 14th April we will be focusing on 'koi fish'. So our meeting will be all about fish and we will hold over our 'Perfect Koi Pond' exercise until May.

I remind all of those koi breeders that we will be holding the "**Best of 4 Koi Competition**" at the April meeting. Bring along 4 baby fish of any variety (bred this season), they can be 4 of the same or any mix (eg 2 showa and 2 ogon) but they will be judged as a team. So best bin wins! Obviously they are this season's breeding so size is expected to be small. We will have a trophy (of sorts!) and a guest judge.

This competition is separate to the Table Show, so if you have bred some great fish this year, don't forget to bring them along to a meeting when they are a bit older to enter them in the Table Show —they then qualify to enter the Table Show class in the Annual Show and may even go on to win Young Champion!

Allan conducted the next workshop about building the perfect koi pond, recapping on Feb's workshop and then discussing a variety of possible filtration setups and construction techniques. We have now collected a lot of information on how to build a perfect koi pond and should be well on the way to publishing that information after the next one or two workshops. A session on BITS and PIECES. These were a number of 5 minute talks by members on B & P's

- Rod on ventrurii ...things that put bubbles (air) in the water
- Fred's water well filter the cheapest and the best
- Dave on trickle down filters, flow down up, what would we do without blue bins!
- Tony on a simple vacuum cleaner (pond) that even the men could use!!!

Koi theft–Oklahoma USA

A series of koi thefts has been happening in the metro area since last fall and it appears the situation has been escalating in recent weeks. Businesses and homes in Moore, Shawnee and Edmond have been affected. The most recent burglary was at an Edmond home, where \$10,000 worth of fish was taken sometime between Jan. 1 and Jan. 5.



After the Oct. 27 theft, when \$35,000 of koi was reported stolen, the business increased the lighting and surveillance cameras.

Don Connley (right), owner of Crosstimber Koi, said, "They have to be a specific type of criminal. They would have to be organized, be knowledgeable and have a market for them. If not, five minutes later they (the fish) would be dead."


The KSWA Annual Koi Show is on again!

Koi and koi related products will be available for sale on the day.

Entry for members is free—please bring along your membership card. Non-member entry is \$3 for adults and \$1 for children.



If you are interested in entering the Annual Show, our "Show Entry Pack" contains everything you need to know about entering including a copy of the Rules, an entry form and tips for preparation.

This pack will be available on our web site shortly. Alternatively, come along to any meeting or call a committee member to have a pack posted out to you.

As always, members who are showing for the first time don't pay entries fees, so have a chat to any committee member (or any member who has entered the Show) if you think it's something you might be interested in.

This year the committee have decided that the small blue judging bins will be dispensed with. On the morning of the Show, you can simply put your fish in your main bin and you will not need to move them throughout the day, or listen out for your classes. After much debate, this arrangement was believed to be of benefit to both fish (not needing to be caught & moved) and our showing Members (who can now relax a bit more on Show day)

This year's Table Show class has been split into 4 classes, rather than just 2:

- Table Show A (kohaku, sanke, showa, utsuri)
- Table Show B (the 10 varieties not included elsewhere)
- Table Show Kinginrin A
- Table Show Kinginrin B

The winners from each of these 4 go on to compete for Young Champion.

This will give those members who concentrate on varieties other than the 4 "Go Sanke" varieties (also called "A") more opportunity to show young fish.
